Program Philosophy

Marina Girls Soccer emphasizes 3 core values – Pride, Tradition, & Excellence. These values build the foundation upon which everything else stands.

PRIDE – It is vastly important that each player begin to establish a strong sense of personal pride in themselves, their team, and their school. High school athletics offers each player an opportunity to showcase their skills, work together as a team, build solid friendships, and be challenged to give their best.

Our aim is for each player to reflect back on their experience with a sense of pride and confidence in their accomplishments.

TRADITION – In a day and age where everything is become much more segmented and individualized, it becomes important to include a sense of history and tradition in daily life. We are building something very special here at Marina HS, and Marina Girls Soccer. Everyone is contributing.

Players have an opportunity to leave a legacy; to be remembered.

Tradition is an important value to our program because it gives players a sense of belonging, not only for one season, but for many years – if not longer. Tradition is a way of recognizing where we've been as well as who has been with us, and who is with us now.

EXCELLENCE – Athletic competition is a fantastic venue for players to continuously strive to become excellent – to strive to be their best. There is high-drama in athletics, and the stories sometimes become legendary. But beyond the legend and memories, there is a lone player out on the field, after the game is over and the crowd has left, who is continuing to practice; she is seeking improvement, and excellence.

It is important that we confirm that excellence is something we are, not something we do. Excellence is an attitude more than it is an award. Too often we get blinded by the scoreboard, or the newsprint, which tell a one-sided story.

Instead, we must look inside to our own monitor – that's where the truth is. We know inside ourselves whether we're giving it 100% or not. We are the only ones who can decide what excellence is.

Teams

Frosh/Soph

This team is comprised of only Freshmen and Sophomores for the main purpose of developing individual skill. This is an introductory level to high school soccer, as it differs greatly from club, or any other organized team. Players participating on the F/S level will receive their major instruction in the fundamental areas of dribbling, receiving & passing, shooting, and defending. Additional priorities will be placed on physical fitness, and aggression.

JV

This team is comprised of Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors who have shown a good balance of individual skills as well as a basic tactical understanding. At this level, individual skill is expected to be at level which permits the teaching of particular group strategies, such as zonal defending, off-balance attacking, and general organized team play.

As should be expected in an upper level team, there must also be an increase in each players fitness, ball-winning, and physical play. Players are expected to play through a small level of pain, understanding the difference between being hurt and being injured.

Varsity

This is a team comprised of players from any academic grade who prove to have one or more key qualities which fit into the greater context of the group and the Marina Girls Soccer Program as a whole. At the varsity level, very little attention is paid to individual skills as players are expected to be of a certain ability which allows for more advanced teaching. Concepts such as zonal defending, pressing, numerous formations, game management, and sport psychology are the major focus.

Levels of effort, mentality, aggression, leadership, and courage are expected to be high and sustainable. Players are held to a higher accountability, both in their performances (in practices and games) and in their attitudes and actions. Players must also be good at managing their time to keep their grades up.

Boosters

The Marina Girls Soccer Booster Club is an independent, tax-exempt organization operating for the sole purpose of supporting the Marina Girls Soccer Program. All members are volunteers who donate their time and energy to see the vision of Marina Girls Soccer and Marina High School accomplished. Please note: the Marina Girls Soccer Booster Club and Marina Girls Soccer work together in the areas of fundraising, social events, and communications. Marina Girls Soccer Booster Club, and its members have NOTHING to do with player selection, team selection, or the coaching of the Marina Girls Soccer program.

Fundraising

Marina Girls Soccer cannot survive without the dedication and contribution of its supporters and business partners. Fundraising is crucial to the health and longevity of the program. Each year, new equipment is needed including uniforms, balls, training equipment, administrative supplies, and more.

In an effort to keep our fundraising efforts low, and profits high, the program relies on only a few key fundraisers. These include:

Letter Drive Fundraising

This is a fundraising effort where each player sends a pre-designed letter to family and friends who may be willing to support the program. Each recipient automatically receives a package of money saving coupons for use in their local community, whether they donate or not.

This year, the Letter Drive Fundraising Event will be held on Friday Nov. 20th. All players **MUST** attend. Player should have already completed and turned in the Letter Drive Fundraising List.

Business Banner

This is an opportunity for local businesses and merchants to advertise on the fence that runs along Edinger. Players will raise all the funds needed to cover their fees with one business sponsorship.

The sponsorship includes 1 business banner, a ½ page ad in the memory book, & a sponsor link on MarinaGirlsSoccer.com.

Memory Book

An opportunity for businesses and individuals to advertise and promote in the year-end memory book. Players receive ½ credit toward their fees.

Sponsor-A-Ball Program

Each year, the program must replace 25% of the balls. Some get lost, some stolen, some hit over the fence into the moat – never to return. Still, some just can't hold air any longer. This program is a simple way that people can make a tax-deductible donation of \$25 to help us replace the balls.

Magazine Fundraising

This is an on-going fundraising that offers magazine readers up to 93% off the cover price of their favorite magazines! There are over 650 magazine titles, including National Geographic, Time, Sports Illustrated, and BH&G. The best part about it is that MGS gets 40% of the purchase amount.

PLAYER FUNDRAISING REQUIREMENT:

Each player must complete the Letter Drive Fundraising List with at a minimum of 12 names and addresses. The names should be of individuals who know and care for the player. There are prompts on the list of particular individuals who may be used; however the player can select anyone whom they wish to ask for support.

Each player must attend the Letter Drive Fundraising Event to be held on Nov. 20th. This is where the letters will be stuffed, addressed, and mailed. Should a player be unable to attend this event, arrangements must be made to complete the mailers in a timely manner.

This is also the date where players will receive their uniform and equipment for the season. There is no make up date.

FUNDRAISING FOR PLAYER FEES

Because it does cost money to play high school sports, we want to give each family the opportunity they deserve. We have several different fundraising opportunities for each girl to participate in. Some of these programs will credit 100% of the profit directly toward player fees. Below is a list of each fundraising program.

- MARINA GIRLS SOCCER BANNER AD – covers 100% of fees
- MGS BANNER AD RENEWAL - 50% toward fees
- MEMORY BOOK ADS – 50% toward fees
- SPONSOR A BALL - 50% toward fees
- LETTER DRIVE – 100% toward program expenses
- MAGAZINE SALES – 100% toward program expenses
- VIKING CARDS – 100% toward fees
- PARTYLITE CANDLES – 100% toward fees
- COOKIE DOUGH SALES – 100% toward fees
- CUSTOMER LOYALTY – 100% toward fees

The Playing Time Issue

Players play, coaches coach, parents watch. This progression is how Marina Girls Soccer understands and interprets the playing time issue. Since parents have a limited involvement in the program, so must be their vocalized opinions and interjections regarding the playing time of any player.

Marina Girls Soccer aims to include as many willing participants in the program as possible. There are many valuable life lessons that can be taught through being a part of a team, such as sacrifice, teamwork, devotion, patience, hard-work, perseverance, and community. These are values that are not easy to come by. It is NOT a consideration that all players must play in order to benefit from the program.

Players must grow up. It is time that they start taking ownership and responsibility of their life. There is no better place for them to practice such skills than in the setting of high school athletics and Marina Girls Soccer. Parent interference only impedes maturation and growth.

RULES:

1. If a player has not brought their issue of playing time to the coach, there is NO issue.
2. No coach will discuss playing time with a parent whose player has not sought to speak, autonomously, to their coach.
3. There is NO guarantee that discussing playing time with their coach will result in an increase of playing time.
4. **THERE IS NO GUARANTEED PLAYING TIME – FOR ANYBODY, AT ANY LEVEL.**

Steps to take:

1. The Player must request a private audience with their coach to discuss the issue.
2. The Player, Parent(s), and Coach meet together to discuss the issue.
3. The Player, Parent(s), Coach, and Head Coach, meet together to discuss the issue.
4. The Player, Parent(s), Head Coach, and Athletic Director meet together to discuss the issue.
5. The Player, Parent(s), Head Coach, Athletic Director, and MHS Principal(s) meet together to discuss the issue.

Marina Girls Soccer is a voluntary activity and any participants are free to exit the program at any time.

Parent Issues

Marina Girls Soccer is a program of particular life-long values and qualities that we hope to help bring about in each player. It is expected that, by participating in the program, players AND their family and friends, when associating themselves with Marina Girls Soccer (i.e. at games and events) act in accordance with such values. Failure to do so, by any party, may result in the immediate and permanent removal of that player from the program.

Marina Girls Soccer is dedicated to the development and enrichment of the players. We seek to provide a safe, and fun environment where the kids can build friendships, learn lessons, and play soccer.

RULES:

1. There is absolutely NO communication (in any form) with the coach permitted during the game.
2. There is a MANDATORY 24-hour cooling-off period, beginning immediately after a game, where parents may NOT approach their coach with any grievance or complaint.
3. Parents are expected to act at all times with respect toward Marina HS, and Marina Girls Soccer, including its coaches, staff, players and parents.
4. If a parent cannot act with dignity and respect toward all, they will not be permitted to participate or attend any Marina Girls Soccer event, and their actions could result in the suspension and/or expulsion of their player from the program.

Upon the offense:

1. The coach will address the issue with the parent(s) directly.

If there is still an issue...

2. The Parent will be dismissed from the game and/or event.

If there is still an issue...

3. The Parent will be barred from attending any and all games and/or events.

If there is still an issue...

4. The Player will be terminated from the Marina Girls Soccer Program.

Marina Girls Soccer reserves the right to hold the player, directly and/or indirectly accountable for the actions of their parent(s)/guardian.

Season Expectations - Player

It is expected that each individual player understand and abides by the following:

Academics:

1. All academic work is of the up-most priority. Players who are not maintaining a minimum grade point average of at least a 2.0 will be suspended from any involvement with the team, including practices, games, and other team events.
2. Players falling behind in their work must meet with their coach to work out a plan to help them get back on track. Such a plan may include a reduction in practice or game time in order to get caught up.
3. Should a player miss a significant amount of school, perhaps for a prolonged illness, it is advisable that all academic work be completed prior to returning to participate with the team.

Administrative

1. Players may NOT participate in any practices or games until they first have been cleared by the Marina HS Administration. This includes a physical examination, an academic check, and a transportation fee paid to MHS. Clearance cards are available in the MHS Activities Office – 301.
2. Players who complete their physical in the spring through the MHS Trainer are cleared for the entire year – Spring '09 thru Spring '10. In addition, by utilizing the MHS Trainer players help keep the training room staffed and supplied with important tools and equipment. It is they only way the training room can fully operate.
3. Players must complete ALL paperwork as required not only by the Marina HS administration, but also by Marina Girls Soccer. The following forms must be completed prior to participation in any game or contest:
 - a. Player Commitments
 - b. Uniform Rental Agreement
 - c. Letter Drive Fundraising List

Practices

1. Practices will be held every day after school for roughly 2 hours. Exact practice times will be assigned by the coach.
2. Players are expected to attend every practice even when (mildly) sick or injured.
3. Players must be dressed in proper practice uniform in order to participate. This includes:
 - a. Soccer Shoes
 - b. Socks
 - c. Soccer Shorts
 - d. Shin guards
 - e. Marina Shirt – or blank-white t-shirt
4. Players may NOT wear any part of their game uniform to practice.
5. Players needing to make up work or meet with their teachers for academic reasons should try to do so during lunch time hours. If that is not possible, players may then do so during practice time. We do NOT need a note from your teacher!

6. If a player must leave early from a practice, it is advisable to inform the coach as soon as possible. For example, if you have an ortho-appointment set for Thursday, tell the coach on Monday or Tuesday.
7. Practice performances, including absences, will directly influence playing time.
8. It is the player's responsibility to get water for their team. Players should go and fill up their own water bottles, or get water from the training room. One small 12 oz. water bottle is NOT enough to keep hydrated.
9. All players are expected to help clean up and reorganize the equipment. Failure to keep the bin clean and organized will result in disciplinary consequences.
10. Practice ends when the coach dismisses the team.
11. Players who are not adhering to, or contributing to the positive community of Marina Girls Soccer will be immediately disciplined. This may include lack of playing time, relegation to a lower level team, suspension, and/or expulsion from the program.

Games

1. Games are typically held on Tuesdays and Thursdays, but not always. There are some weekend tournaments as well as a few atypical days – such as Monday games. Please check the schedule frequently to keep up-to-date.
2. Players are expected to arrive on-time to each game (one hour prior to kickoff), with all the following items:
 - a. Marina Girls Soccer Equipment Bag
 - b. Both Sets of Uniforms
 - c. Marina Girls Soccer Parka/Sweatshirt
 - d. Team game shirt – as decided by the team.
3. Players may NOT wear gear representing teams and/or companies other than Marina Girls Soccer. This includes equipment bags, warm-ups, and/or game t-shirts.
4. Players may only bring their equipment bag to the field. NO SCHOOL BACKPACKS or any thing of the sort is permitted to be at the field.
5. The bench area is to remain a TEAM ONLY area. No friends or family may sit on or directly beside/behind the bench. Parents may drop off water, or belongings, to their player, but then must remove themselves from the team area.
6. Players are expected to set up the field, including the goals and goal weights, corner flags, benches – providing one for the visiting team first – and water. At the end of the game, players are also expected to tear down the field and return all equipment to the bin.

Games - Away

1. Players are expected to arrive at the bus (out in front of the gym) by the departure time.
2. NO player should board the bus without permission from the coach. If a coach has not yet arrived, players are expected to sit outside the bus and wait to board when the coach arrives.
3. Players may bring iPods and MP3 players for the bus ride. However, they do so at their own risk.
4. All players MUST ride the bus both to and from away games.

5. Often, when we arrive at the away school, class is still in session. Players are expected to conduct themselves in a more than appropriate manner by keeping their voices down and refraining from any disturbing behavior.
6. In the event where there is ample time before or after a game (Varsity plays after JV), players are expected to utilize such times to complete their homework assignments.
7. Players may NEVER leave the campus of the school or location of the playing field at ANY time, for ANY reason.

On the Field of Play

1. Players are expected to keep the values and integrity of the program at the forefront of their mind whenever they compete for Marina Girls Soccer. Player should play hard, and play to win, without jeopardizing the safety and/or dignity of anyone involved. This includes the officials, the members of the other team, their coach, and their fans. Any violation will be dealt with swiftly.
2. Players are a part of the whole, and must understand that being so requires both responsibility and sacrifice. Not everyone will play the entire game. Players must accept their role in the team and continue to pursue excellence within that capacity.
3. Players are expected to be encouraging and supportive at all times. Though disagreements may occur, there is never a need to disagree openly, especially on the playing field.
4. Any player that receives a yellow-card, according to the rules of HS soccer, must leave the field of play. They may be substituted back in on the next available substitution.
5. Any player that receives a red card, must leave the field of play immediately, and will not be available for the remainder of that particular game, as well as the following game. Red card offenses will also be reviewed by the Marina Girls Soccer staff, and the Marina Athletic Department. Further action may result.

Off the Field of Play

1. Players are responsible for their actions and how they reflect on the program. Player MUST NEVER say or do anything that will put the program in a poor light.
2. Should a player actions harm the reputation and good-standing of Marina Girls Soccer, they may be disciplined which may include suspension and/or expulsion from the program.

Communication

1. All information is supplied on our website – MarinaGirlsSoccer.com. Players should check here for the latest information regarding team schedules, game times, and important announcements.
2. The Marina Email Club is the preferred method of communication from MGS staff to the players and parents. It is expected that both the player and parent sign-up via the website to maintain the constant flow of communication.
3. Weekly or Bi-Weekly announcements will be sent via the Marina Email Club. These announcements will highlight key events and happenings within Marina Girls Soccer.
4. For private concerns, players/parents may contact their coach via the email address as listed on the website.

Player Issues

1. Should a player have an issue with regards to the program, their team, or their participation within Marina Girls Soccer, that player must communicate with their coach in order to find resolution. No further action may be taken prior to this step. Such issues include:
 - a. Playing time
 - b. Player positions
 - c. Team attitudes
2. If, after a player has tried to resolve it on their own, the issue remains, then, **AND ONLY THEN**, may the player invite their parent(s) in to help with communicating to the coach and finding resolution.
3. Should the issue still remain, it may be necessary to call in the assistance of the MGS head coach, Mike, as well as the Marina Administration, including the Athletic Directors, the Vice Principal, and the School Principal.

Player Commitments

_____ I understand that practices will be held everyday after school starting Nov. 9th and ending Mid February. I also understand that there will be games after school and on weekends. It is my commitment to attend each practice and game and to give my best effort throughout the entire season.

_____ I understand that I will be required to attend practice and play in games during Christmas break. The exact dates will be given at a later time.

_____ I understand that I will be responsible for my uniform and any other equipment loaned to me through Marina Soccer. I will commit to taking special care of all my equipment, both personal and loaned. In addition, I also commit to turning in all my loaned equipment at the appropriate time as will be communicated later in the season.

_____ I understand that I will be required to have all the equipment necessary for me to attend practice. This includes cleats, shin guards, matching soccer socks (not two different colored socks), soccer shorts (of any color), and either a "Marina" shirt, or a blank-white T-shirt. I understand that failure to dress in my proper practice attire will exclude me from practices and games.

_____ I understand that I am committing my time and best effort to the program as a whole. I place the success of the program above the success of myself. I will seek to help the program in any way that I can. This will include, being a positive team player, lending a helping hand to others, and refraining from doing anything that may give the Marina Girls Soccer Program a bad name.

_____ I understand that there will be a financial obligation that must be met in order to participate in the program (uniform rental fees, equipment needs, etc). I commit to ensuring that all fees are paid on time and without hassle. Fee amounts and due dates are forthcoming. I also understand that fundraising is provided so that I do not have to pay all the fees out of my pocket.

_____ I understand that I must participate in any and all fundraising activities for this 2009-2010 season, which may or may not include fundraising activities before, during, or after school time hours. It is my commitment to participate with my best effort and to meet the minimum fundraising standard as will be described to me at a future date. I understand that failure to meet the minimum fundraising requirement is a failure to participate in a major part of the Marina Girls Soccer Program, which may result in my dismissal from the program.

_____ I understand that I am first and foremost a student at Marina High School. Any academic or disciplinary problems I may be having must be solved prior to attending or competing in any practice or game. I commit to completing all assignments and school work with my best effort. I also commit to taking advantage of the other hours in the day given to me to complete my academic responsibilities. I understand I may have to limit the amount of time I spend brainlessly staring at a television set, or the hours I invest with a phone lodged in my ear, or the number of key strokes I make IM'ing or MySpace'ing my friends.

I have read and agreed to all of the above. It is my intention to think, speak, and do my very best at all times, knowing that I am proudly associated with Marina Girls Soccer.

Uniform Rental Agreement

In addition to the uniforms, I will have an equipment bag and a program parka. I understand that these items (bag & parka) are mine to keep, however, should this equipment become lost or unusable, I will be required to obtain another item at my cost.

At the close of the season, I agree to return all items listed below in good condition. The items I have received will be returned in good condition and clean; free from dirt and stains (a blue-tinted white jersey is considered a stain and will not be accepted). I also agree to turn all items in at the appropriate time as will be clearly communicated to me later in the season.

If I fail to turn in a uniform for whatever reason, I understand that I am liable for any replacement costs. Breakdowns of the costs are as follows:

- *Uniform Jersey: \$60.00
- *Uniform Shorts: \$60.00

It is my intention to give my best effort in all my activities at Marina High School. I will wear my uniform with great pride throughout this season and will seek to be an example of excellence both on and off the field.

****If reimbursement is due the soccer program**, it must be made immediately upon receipt of invoice. Failure to clear a player's account will result in paperwork submitted to the school's financial office and the student will not be allowed to register or attend school functions until account has been cleared.
